

# Our Impact for Young People



## Our programme

In 2020 we began building a new programme for young people from disadvantaged backgrounds to provide support and inspiration at important stages on their journey to future employment. The impact of the pandemic on young people's employability led us to develop a new online model of 1:1 career coaching which we now combine with in-school workshops and workplace experiences to support over 3,500 under-represented students aged 11-18 every year.

#### **Working World Workshops**

Delivered in the classroom, giving younger pupils an inspiring introduction to the world of work and challenging stereotypes.

#### **Career Coaching**

Volunteer Coaches from diverse backgrounds and professions help build students' confidence with 1:1 online career sessions, exploring their skills and interests and widening horizons.

#### **Results Day Support**



## The young people we support

We work with schools in areas of multiple deprivation to support students who face the greatest inequity and barriers to future employment. Our volunteers, staff team and employer partners have helped pilot and roll out the MyBigCareer programme supporting over 7,300 young people aged 11-18 since 2020.

## Sustainable Development Goals

We aim to contribute to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals by working with schools, employers and grant-makers to reduce poverty through improved education, access to work and equality of opportunity for young people.



#### **Quality Education**

We help schools provide inclusive and equitable access to Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance.



#### **Reduced Inequalities**

We support young people facing inequality of opportunity as a result of their background, location, ethnicity, gender and other factors.



#### Decent Work and Economic Growth

We help young people overcome barriers to future work, helping them to be inspired, informed and ready to secure meaningful employment.



#### **Gender Equality**

56% of the students we support are underrepresented girls. We introduce them to inspiring women from the world of work.

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## **Supporting** schools

Inspiring pupils from age 11, we raise aspirations for future employment best suited to that individual, irrespective of academic ability. Our programme is active in over 50 schools in six London Boroughs and across North East England, supporting teaching staff to enhance careers guidance provision. We explore each young person's skills, aptitudes and interests, empowering them to pursue their chosen career paths and thrive in the world of work.





We share the Social Mobility Commission's broader view of social mobility for a wider range of people who want to improve their lives, in smaller steps. We support those young people who would otherwise be left behind, widening horizons for all, not just the academically gifted.

We recognise the House of Lords Youth Unemployment Committee recommendations that "beginning Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance at 16 is too late". We sow the seed of inspiration for pupils from age 11, with workshops to help open their minds to the opportunities they can reach for.





### Teacher Feedback

We have shaped our programme in close consultation with teaching staff at our partner schools. Responding to the gap in provision that the schools highlighted to us, we developed new Working World Workshops for younger pupils, offered more online coaching sessions and facilitated more employer encounters for older students.

More than 100 teachers have given their feedback after seeing how their students grew in confidence and career awareness after taking part.




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### Student Feedback




## Young people's stories

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### **Our volunteers**

Volunteers are fundamental to the support we provide to young people. Our programme has been activated by over 360 volunteers from all walks of life and professional backgrounds. Many have lived experience of the barriers underrepresented students face. They offer 1:1 coaching most days during term time, host Insight Days in their workplaces and provide support within schools on Results Day each year.

As Career Coaches, Hosts and Advisors, these inspirational volunteers provide new perspectives and encouragement for young people who often don't have a positive role model in their lives. Many pupils tell us it's the first future career conversation they've had.
